

MASTER SOMMELIER DIPLOMA THEORY EXAM

A RESOURCE GUIDE

Purpose Statement

Candidates pursuing Master Sommelier Diploma certification must first successfully complete the Theory portion of the exam. Compared to the Advanced Sommelier Exam, the Master Sommelier Diploma Exam represents a significant step up in difficulty, demanding a far deeper and broader knowledge base. To succeed, candidates need substantial industry experience and a well-structured study plan that covers all topics with the necessary breadth and depth.

The purpose of this document is to help Master Sommelier Diploma Theory candidates understand the range of resources available for study and preparation.

Overview

Creating a study plan begins with understanding yourself as an adult learner. Your methods of gaining understanding now can differ greatly from those of high school or college. Recognizing your unique learning style is key to building an effective strategy.

There is no singular successful method — what works for one candidate may not work for another. The exam relies heavily on foundational knowledge gained at the Introductory, Certified, and Advanced levels. Success comes from mastering and building upon these core principles rather than focusing too heavily on obscure or esoteric details. Try to discover what works best for you and focus on creating study tools and preparation strategies that align with your methodology.

Preparing for CMS upper-level Theory exams demands more than memorizing facts, it requires combining industry experience with extensive research into a variety of resources to gain a well-rounded understanding of each topic. While no single resource can cover everything, a thoughtful mix of books, regional websites, producer insights, and wine media provides essential context and depth.

It is important to stay updated, as alcohol beverage constantly evolves with new trends, producers, styles, maps, and laws; even the best books on any subject can be outdated upon publication. It is essential to balance them with reliable, current sources like government regulation and marketing bodies, importer and producer websites, and respected educational platforms.

The following list is a starting point to support your studies. You do <u>not</u> need to know every single detail they provide! They support a strong learning outline in different ways. Some are more foundational, academic, and encyclopedic (ex, GuildSomm.com, the Oxford Companion to Wine, Decanter, Wine Scholar Guild, etc.). Some are more specific (Wines of South Africa, ChampagneGuide.net, The Oxford Companion to Beer, etc.). Some are more complimentary to confirming trends or other information

(various importer books like Kermit Lynch, blogs like WineAnorak.com, beverage media like The Wine Spectator, etc.). Some focus more on cause and effect (CMS, WSET, Guildsomm.com, etc.), while others support tableside theory investigation (wine lists of the best restaurants worldwide, Oz Clarke's Vintage, etc.). Generally, if there are conflicting reports or facts presented by different resources, rely upon the most established, academic, and contemporary sources. If something is not confirmed or agreed upon by at least four of them, we would not feel it fair to test to.

There are so many resources at our disposal - it is easy to feel overwhelmed. However, themes, trends, and facts that are truly relevant to the sommelier profession become clear relatively quickly with organized research into this comprehensive set of material. Stay patient, be curious, and enjoy the journey!
